Māori Research Strategy: vision

Lower emissions sustainable food systems built on a deep relationship of respect and reciprocity with te Taiao and where the full diversity of Māori landowners, agribusinesses and their iwi, hapū and whānau can thrive.





Māori Research Strategy: values

- Recognises the mauri tapu and mana of Papatuanuku
- Kaitiaki principles and the role of kaitiaki with respect to working with food production systems
- Commitment to honouring te Tiriti of Waitangi through decision-making and resource allocation and investment
- Mātauranga Māori as an equal knowledge system in both Māori agribusiness research and the NZAGRC's wider research programmes
- Working with tangata whenua on their terms with a commitment to making meaningful impact in their communities



Pūtea Rangahau – Tuku Haurehu a Ahuwhenua

- Funding to support Māori innovation on agricultural greenhouse gas emissions
- Priorities include: strengthening baseline data, holistic farm systems research that is led/informed by mātauranga Māori/kaupapa Māori research, tools and resources to reduce GHGs on Māori land and protect soil carbon
- First round worth \$2.8 million, applications close 10 March
- Inclusive, supportive approach to developing research projects
